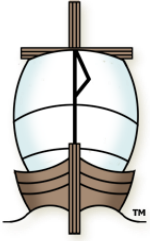

## THE SHIP OF THE CROSS

For Christians, since the days of the apostles, *THE SHIP* has been a symbol for the Christian Church. The mast and yardarm form a simple *CROSS* (in wood) which stands for Jesus who saved us by giving Himself on a cross that we might be forgiven.

The *CHI RHO* ☩ (in metal) is a combination of the first two Greek letters of the name *Christ*, meaning “The Anointed One” or “The Messiah.” *THE WAVES* symbolize the troubles and difficulties of life on earth. *THE SAILS* are filled with wind, a symbol of the Holy Spirit, which empowers the Church. Thus, the Christian Church, under the Cross of Christ, carries the faithful safely across the troubled seas of life to heaven. As we come together for worship, the cross of Christ is before us. We choose, you and I, to worship with people for whom the cross is both the sign of salvation and the sign of Christ in our lives.

**A special welcome to our guests today.** May you find grace and blessing in the time we spend together. We would be most pleased to share with you ways in which you might become a regular part of our Christian fellowship.

## HOLY COMMUNION – WHAT WE BELIEVE



In this Sacrament, Jesus gives us Himself, His true Body and Blood, as we receive the bread and wine. On the night He was betrayed and before He was put to death, Jesus celebrated this Meal with His disciples assuring us that each time we receive it, we are again remembering His death and receiving the full benefits of His grace, namely the forgiveness of sin.

In *1 Corinthians 11*, St. Paul says that we should “examine ourselves” ahead of time. We can do so each time we commune by asking ourselves these basic questions:

- † **Do I acknowledge the fact that I am indeed a sinner and that I am sorry for my sin?**
- † **Do I believe that Jesus Christ is my Savior from all sin?**
- † **Am I trusting in Jesus’ promise that I receive full pardon and strength through this Holy Meal?**
- † **Do I believe that the body and blood of Jesus is truly present in, with, and under the bread and the wine of Holy Communion?**
- † **Finally, with the Lord’s help, will I seek to amend my life and live in conformity with His Holy Will?**

Jesus Himself invites baptized followers who believe in Him as their Lord and Savior, who recognize their sinful condition, and who seek His forgiveness to come to His Table to receive His precious Body and Blood. May the Lord bless your personal reception as well as your daily

living under His power and blessing. Should you have questions, please see a Pastor or a Lay Minister prior to the worship service. If you prefer not to participate in the sacrament, please cross your arms when coming forward to receive a blessing. For those who prefer, **white grape juice is in the center of the tray**. There are also **gluten-free wafers** available by informing the Communion Host. For those who may have **difficulty coming to the front**, please **inform an usher** so that the Sacrament may be brought to you.

## AS WE GATHER

After His resurrection, Jesus appeared to His followers multiple times, not only proving that He was truly alive, but also transforming their fear into faith and their doubt into bold conviction. He walked with them, spoke peace over them, opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and commissioned them to carry His message to the world. These encounters with the risen Christ shaped their lives forever—they were no longer hiding in fear but courageously proclaiming the good news. That same Jesus is with us today. He still brings peace to our anxious hearts, clarity to our confusion, and power to our purpose. Just as He walked with them, He walks with us now, inviting us to live as witnesses of His resurrection and love.

### FIRST READING

*Acts 5:12-29*

Leader: <sup>12</sup>The apostles were performing many miraculous signs and wonders among the people. And all the believers were meeting regularly at the Temple in the area known as Solomon's Colonnade. <sup>13</sup>But no one else dared to join them, even though all the people had high regard for them. <sup>14</sup>Yet more and more people believed and were brought to the Lord—crowds of both men and women. <sup>15</sup>As a result of the apostles' work, sick people were brought out into the streets on beds and mats so that Peter's shadow might fall across some of

them as he went by. <sup>16</sup> Crowds came from the villages around Jerusalem, bringing their sick and those possessed by evil<sup>[a]</sup> spirits, and they were all healed. <sup>17</sup> The high priest and his officials, who were Sadducees, were filled with jealousy. <sup>18</sup> They arrested the apostles and put them in the public jail. <sup>19</sup> But an angel of the Lord came at night, opened the gates of the jail, and brought them out. Then he told them, <sup>20</sup> “Go to the Temple and give the people this message of life!” <sup>21</sup> So at daybreak the apostles entered the Temple, as they were told, and immediately began teaching. When the high priest and his officials arrived, they convened the high council<sup>[b]</sup>—the full assembly of the elders of Israel. Then they sent for the apostles to be brought from the jail for trial. <sup>22</sup> But when the Temple guards went to the jail, the men were gone. So they returned to the council and reported, <sup>23</sup> “The jail was securely locked, with the guards standing outside, but when we opened the gates, no one was there!” <sup>24</sup> When the captain of the Temple guard and the leading priests heard this, they were perplexed, wondering where it would all end. <sup>25</sup> Then someone arrived with startling news: “The men you put in jail are standing in the Temple, teaching the people!” <sup>26</sup> The captain went with his Temple guards and arrested the apostles, but without violence, for they were afraid the people would stone them. <sup>27</sup> Then they brought the apostles before the high council, where the high priest confronted them. <sup>28</sup> “We gave you strict orders never again to teach in this man’s name!” he said. “Instead, you have filled all Jerusalem with your teaching about him, and you want to make us responsible for his death!” <sup>29</sup> But Peter and the apostles replied, “We must obey God rather than any human authority.

Pastor: <sup>1</sup>Once Jesus was in a certain place praying. As he finished, one of his disciples came to him and said, “Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.”  
<sup>2</sup>Jesus said, “This is how you should pray: “Father, may your name be kept holy. May your Kingdom come soon. <sup>3</sup>Give us each day the food we need, <sup>4</sup>and forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And don’t let us yield to temptation!” <sup>5</sup>Then, teaching them more about prayer, he used this story: “Suppose you went to a friend’s house at midnight, wanting to borrow three loaves of bread. You say to him, <sup>6</sup>‘A friend of mine has just arrived for a visit, and I have nothing for him to eat.’ <sup>7</sup>And suppose he calls out from his bedroom, ‘Don’t bother me. The door is locked for the night, and my family and I are all in bed. I can’t help you.’ <sup>8</sup>But I tell you this though he won’t do it for friendship’s sake, if you keep knocking long enough, he will get up and give you whatever you need because of your shameless persistence. <sup>9</sup>“And so I tell you, keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. <sup>10</sup>For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. <sup>11</sup>“You fathers if your children ask for a fish, do you give them a snake instead? <sup>12</sup>Or if they ask for an egg, do you give them a scorpion? Of course not! <sup>13</sup>So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him.”
